

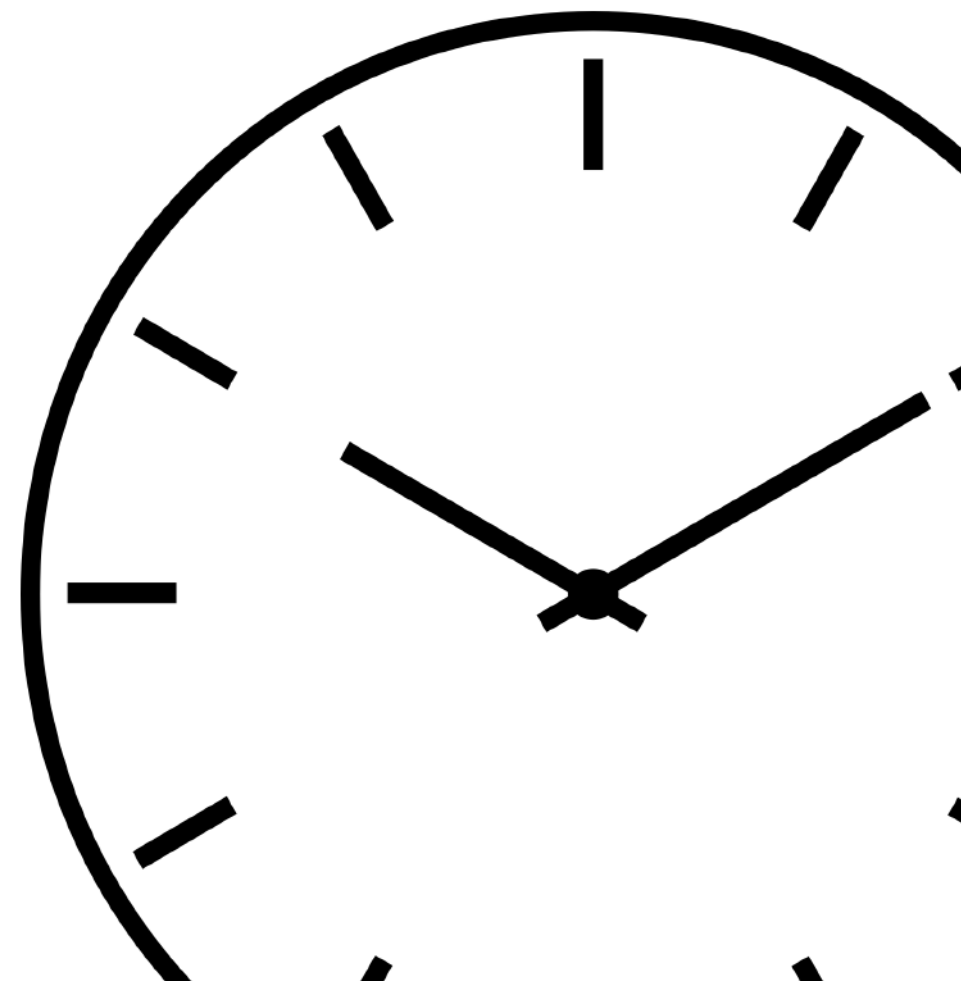

# QUESTION 1

ANSWER

Almost three quarters  
(74.8%) or 33 million adults



## QUESTION 2

Out of 1,731 adults in England what % that agreed with the statement, 'I am interested in the history of the local area where I live'?

(YouGov 2018)



ANSWER

71%





## QUESTION 3

Out of those 1,731 adults what % agreed with the statement ‘finding new uses for historic buildings is better than demolishing them’?

(YouGov 2018)



ANSWER

87%



## QUESTION 4

What % people living in areas where significant heritage-led regeneration had taken place, agreed that investment in the historic environment had resulted in a nicer place in which to live, work and socialise?

(Amion and Locum 2010)

Over 90%

(Heritage Lottery Fund's 2015 report 20 Years in 12 Places)



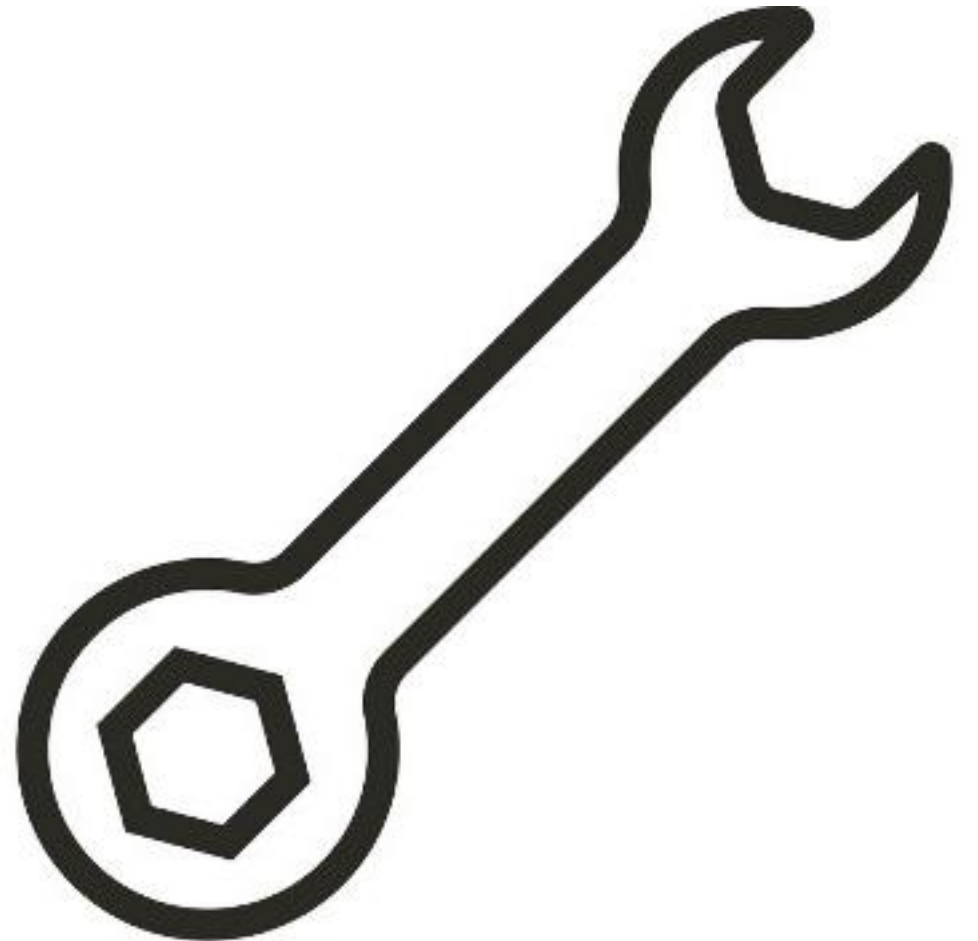
